

Use of Scripts is Strictly Forbidden

Current Emory Libraries' database licensing agreements strictly forbid using any type of scripts to generate searches and mine content; examples of these databases would be Nexis (LexisNexis) and Factiva. Vendors will not hesitate to turn off all access to their databases without prior notification. See the section below for exceptions: Emory Licensed Sources of Data and Text Analysis.

This is not a question of the intent or purpose for the research; running searches for academic research is not the issue. The noncompliance issue is the method by which you are searching the database's content, e.g. using a script.

Harvesting Data Legally

If you need to harvest data for your research, contact Ron Harris (ron.harris@emory.edu) in order to explore alternative options; for example, Nexis does allow you to pay for a separate licensing agreement that is specifically intended for harvesting content.

One additional point of clarification: While our licenses do allow for manual searches, most of the vendors impose record limits; if you exceed it they will turn off access. It is recommended that when conducting manual searches, if you need large amounts of data or text, contact Susan Klopper (susan.klopper@emory.edu) in advance of running your searches so she can reach out to the vendor.
