Emory’s Rose Library will celebrate LGBT History Month with the return of its popular drag show on Oct. 9, a booth at Atlanta’s Pride Festival Oct. 12-13, and an open house of artifacts on Oct. 8 that document Atlanta’s LGBTQ+ history, arts and culture.

In addition, don’t miss “Atlanta’s 1990s LGBTQ+ and Arts Scene: A Talk with Artist Royce Soble and Curator Randy Gue,” a Rose event during Emory’s Homecoming Weekend that is open to the public at no charge. Photographer Soble has chronicled LGBTQ life and culture in Atlanta for more than three decades, and Rose Library houses their collection of images. 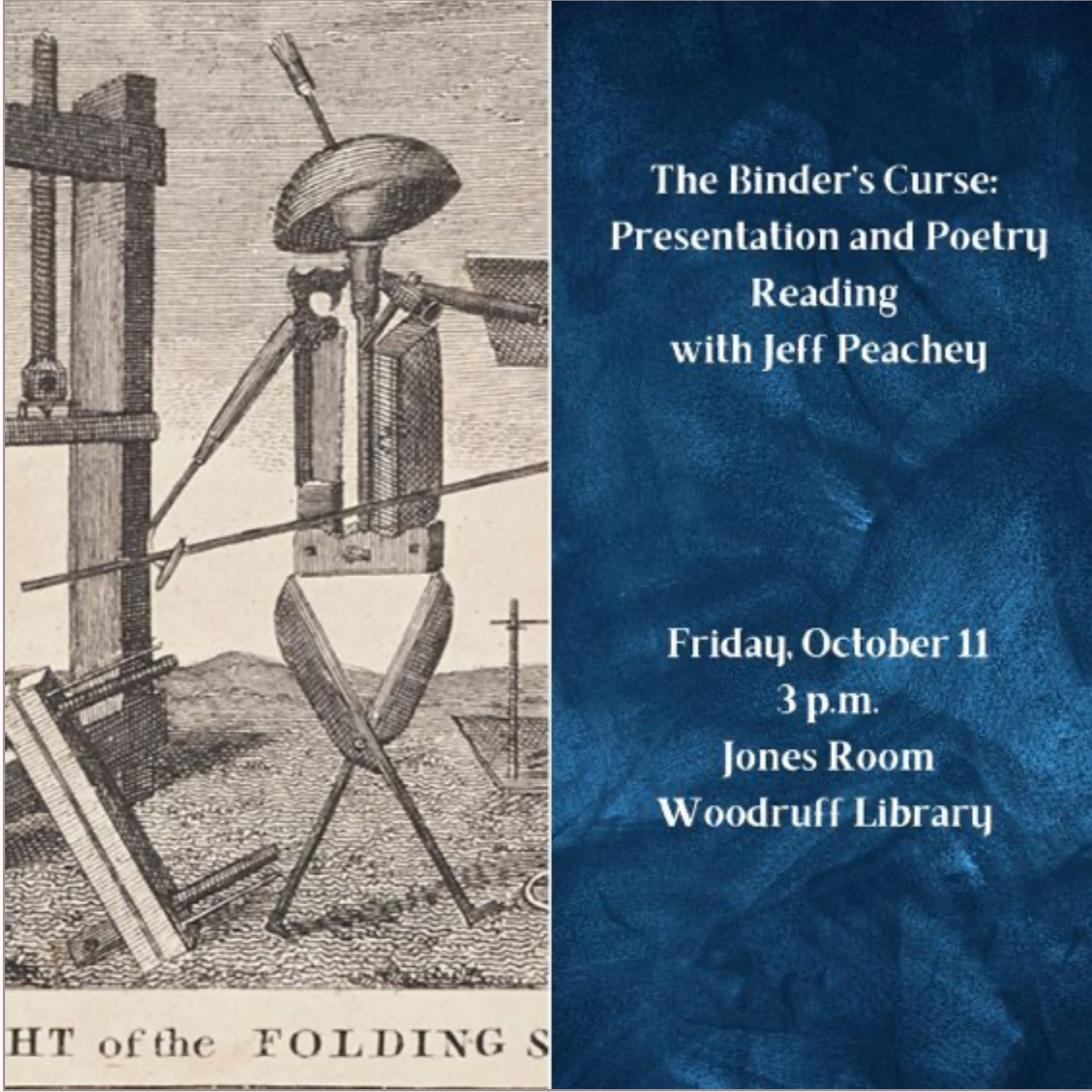

Come enjoy the quirky and outright strange sense of humor from 18th century bookbinder and erstwhile poet John Bradford when conservator John Peachey gives a presentation on Bradford’s work and writings on Friday, Oct. 11, at 3 p.m. in the Jones Room. The event will include readings from Bradford’s poem “The Binder’s Curse,” from his book “The Poetical Vagaries of the Knight of the Folding-Stick of Paste-Castle and The History of the Garrett” (1815).

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
