

"Howl" was the subject of a 1957 landmark obscenity trial, and Ginsberg's trial notes are on display in the Beats exhibition in the Schatten Gallery.

In these letters, the man who would become America's 44th president is still searching for a greater understanding of the world and his place in it, even as he navigates the everyday obstacles of college




