

Even though Emory was unable to host and display the Quilt on the Quad for World AIDS Day on Dec. 1 due to COVID-19 restrictions this year (the Woodruff Library usually displays the quilt afterward), we can still see the quilt and remember those lost to HIV/AIDS. The National AIDS Memorial digitized the quilt panels and created a virtual display, so people can view the quilt from home.
